PARKING


The Platform Innovation Centre is situated inside a parkade operated by the Calgary Parking Authority from Mondays to Sundays [24-hours]. There are 509 stalls above ground parkade [9 accessible stalls] and six [6] public Electric Vehicle Charging Stations. The parkade has a clearance of 2.03m [6' 8"]. The main entrance to the parkade is located on 3rd St SE and 9th Ave SE.

KEYNOTE

SPEAKER: DANIELLE SKOGEN | REAL HUMANITARIAN

Danielle Skogen B.Ed. has been a leader in the international gender equity and women's empowerment movement since 2013 where, alongside the Anea Bogue and the REALgirl Foundation, she co-founded SERniña, a grassroots Guatemalan girls empowerment organization. Upon moving back to Canada in 2019, she joined Real Humanitarian, a Canadian organization, to co-create a customized version of the REALgirl Program to fit the unique needs of their Ethiopian centers. Today, Danielle continues to be an advocate for change and equity as a



coach and consultant for organizations and leaders supporting areas such as fundraising, program design, grant writing and gender-transformative approaches. Overall, Danielle has helped secure over 2.6 million dollars for gender and child-centered causes, co-created over 300 hours of empowerment and equity curriculum, and helped bring transformational equity and empowerment programs to over 3,000 people living in the Global South. In all that she does, Danielle believes that taking a holistic approach is key to creating lasting change and that we all benefit when our entire 'human team' has the opportunity to reach their highest potential.

DR. AAMIR JAMAL | UNIVERSTIY OF CALGARY



Dr. Aamir Jamal is an Associate Professor of International Social Development and Director Global Engagement at the University of Calgary. Dr. Jamal is a multidisciplinary scholar and change-maker with a PhD in International Social Development from University of Calgary, a MBA from Adelphi University, New York, and over 25 years of work in the development sector. He is a thought leader in the sphere of men's engagement in gender justice, prevention of domestic violence, girls' education and women rights in the global south. He has produced a significant body of research that has informed policy and practice for national governments

and international agencies. His research emerges from a strong social justice perspective and is focused primarily on three areas: engaging men in gender justice; the effectiveness of International NGOs in the development sector; and Muslim youth, identity construction in context of global conflicts. He was honored by the City of Calgary with the prestigious International Achievement Award in 2021, the Arch Award for International Career Achievement in 2022, and the Sustainability Award for Faculty Research in 2022.


ALISA TUKKIMAKI | END FGM CANADA NETWORK
